BBQ TICKETS ON SALE NOW!



THE SOROPTIMIST CLUB DONATES COLLECTOR'S PLATES TO MUSEUM

As a result of the generosity of Catherine Gasich, Harriet Jackson, and Dorothy Buhle, members of the former Soroptimist Club of Sunnyvale-Cupertino, the Museum now has eighteen of the club's limited edition collector's plates designed by artist Carl E. Lewis and depicting Le Petit Trianon (now the home of the California History Center). Le Petit Trianon is a a replica of the French Petit Trianon and was built circa 1890 by Charles A. Baldwin, a country gentleman whose Millefleurs Winery and Vineyards occupied the property now part of the De Anza College campus. These early 1970's plates made by Preston-Hopkinson Company, Appomattox, Virginia wonderful gifts of Cupertino history. They are on sale in the Museum for \$75.00 each.
